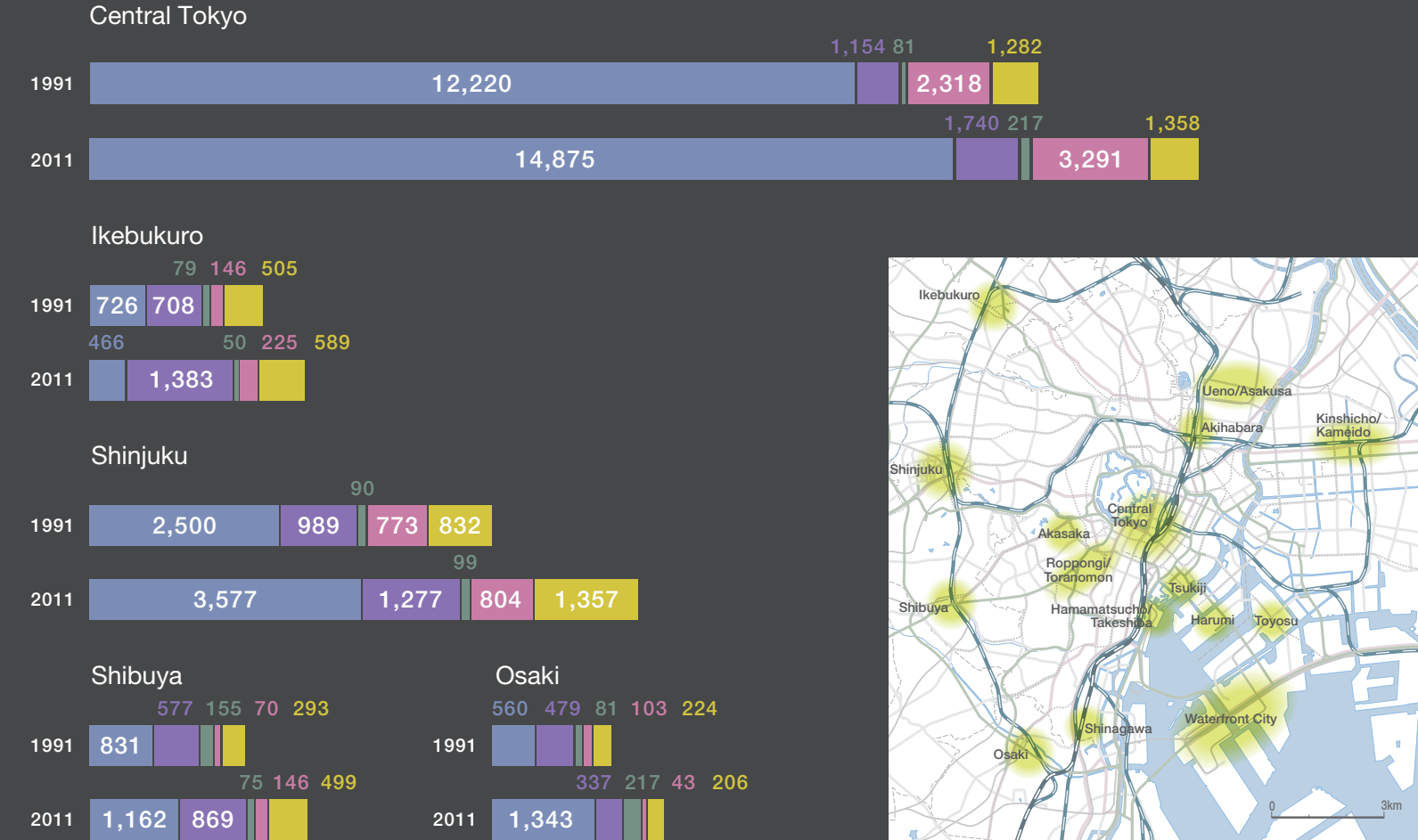
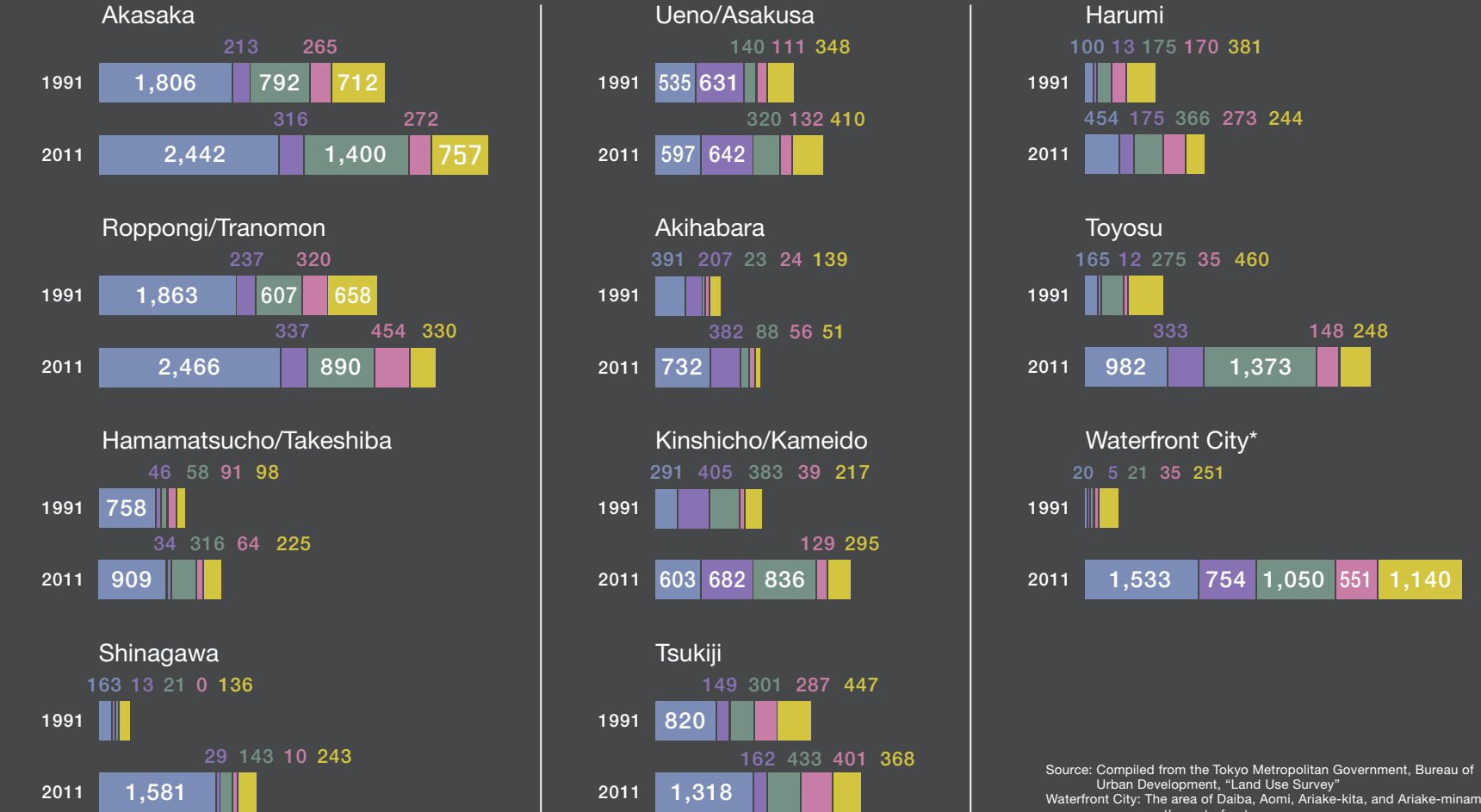


GREATER CONCENTRATION

■ Services: Floor area of office facilities
 ■ Commerce: Floor area of dedicated commercial and joint residential/commercial facilities
 ■ Residential: Floor area of detached housing and multi-family residences
■ Living: Floor area of government buildings, educational and cultural facilities, and health and welfare facilities
■ Other: Floor area of factories, joint residential/factory buildings, warehouse and transport-related facilities, lodging facilities, sports and recreation facilities, and supply and disposal facilities (1,000 m²)



Central Tokyo has recently been seeing the development of business centers that have diverse functionality with an accumulation of commercial, residential and other facilities. These centers support Tokyo's convenience and brisk economy. New centers include the Waterfront City, Toyosu, and Shinagawa.
